'CTRL+ALT+DELETE' at UT Lab Theatre

The Clarence Brown Theatre's 2013-14 season continues with the Oct. 24-Nov. 10 production of the play "CTRL+ALT+DELETE" in the University of Tennessee company's Lab Theatre.

The play explores what happens when a young man masterminds a new handheld device that can revolutionize communication. Greed, scheming and ambition all figure into the story. The play is directed by UT theater faculty member Terry Silver-Alford.

Silver-Alford calls "CTRL+ALT+DELETE" a "satire of the marketplace." The play, he says, pits "idealism against the harsh realities of the business world" as it "creates a suspenseful and 'telling tale' about youthful dreams, ambition, disillusion, and greed in the often cutthroat
