About the Playwright Tom Stoppard



Tom Stoppard's most recent play, *The Hard Problem*, opened at the National Theatre in 2015. He wrote his first play, *Enter a Free Man*, whilst working as a journalist in Bristol. His plays include *Rosencrantz And Guildenstern Are Dead, The Real Inspector Hound, After Magritte, Jumpers, Travesties, Every Good Boy Deserves Favour* (a play for actors and orchestra written with André Previn), *Night and Day, The Real Thing, Hapgood, Arcadia, Indian Ink, The Invention Of Love, The Coast Of Utopia,*

Rock'n'Roll, Dogg's Our Pett, New-Found Land, Dogg's Hamlet and Cahoot's Macbeth. Adaptations include Tango, Undiscovered Country, On The Razzle, Rough Crossing and Dalliance. Translations include The Seagull, Henry IV, Ivanov, and The Cherry Orchard, The House of Bernarda Alba and Largo Desolato. He has written eight Evening Standard award-winning plays and five of his plays have won Tony awards. Radio plays include Darkside (set to Pink Floyd's album, The Dark Side of the Moon), On 'Dover Beach', If You're Glad, I'll Be Frank, Albert's Bridge (Italia Prize Winner), M Is For Moon Among Other Things, The Dissolution Of Dominic Boot, Where Are They Now?, Artist Descending A Staircase, The Dog It Was That Died and In The Native State. Television adaptations include Parades End (BBC/HBO), A Walk On The Water (from Enter A Free Man), Three Men In A Boat and The Dog It Was That Died. Original television screenplays include Another Moon Called Earth, A Separate Peace, Neutral Ground, Teeth and Professional Foul, which won awards from BAFTA, the Broadcasting Press Guild and Squaring The Circle. He adapted his television dramatisation of Jerome K Jerome's Three Men in a Boat for BBC Radio. Screenplays include Anna Karenina, Despair, The Romantic Englishwoman, The Human Factor, Brazil, Empire Of The Sun, The Russia House, Billy Bathgate, Poodle Springs, and Shakespeare In Love (with Marc Norman), which won him an Academy Award for Best Original Screenplay, a Golden Globe and the Broadcast Film Critics and American Guild Awards for Best Screenplay 1998. He directed and wrote the screenplay for the film of Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead, which won the Prix d'Or at the Venice Film Festival 1990 for Best Film. Tom Stoppard is a CBE and was knighted in 1997.

"No one is allowed to the leave the room...one of us is a murderer!"

These lines or similar ones have been spoken in numerous "whodunit" murder mysteries for decades. The term "whodunit" originated in the early 1930's, but the murder mystery genre has been around long before that (take *Hamlet* for example). Our fascination with murder is ancient and countless novels, plays, films and television shows have focused on that topic. From the classics like Sherlock Holmes and any of the Agatha Christie works, to the modern grizzly forensic crime shows (Criminal Minds) we are challenged and excited to work out the puzzle and "find the killer". It is also interesting to note, that the longest continuously running play in the world is Agatha Christie's murder mystery The Mousetrap, which boasts over 27,000 performances to date. Celebrated Tony and Academy award winning British playwright Tom Stoppard cleverly models his "whodunit" after Christie's Mousetrap in a multi-layered "send-up" of the entire genre. Not only does he have a good time poking fun at the whodunit genre, he also ridicules the entire theatrical experience, especially the roles of theatre critics. "Things are not what they seem to be" resonates loudly in The Real Inspector Hound. And, you, the audience may find yourselves involved in something quite unlike anything you've ever experienced before.
